All Dolores students and teachers are welcome to a free library card, regardless if they live in our library district.



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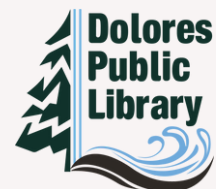

Elementary Level



The TumbleBook Library has animated, narrated story books, as well as read-alongs and eBooks to develop independent reading.



Explora is a student-friendly search interface for safe, trustworthy information. It facilitates access to age-appropriate articles, eBooks and magazines. The Lexile reading level is given for every result.

Secondary Level



This encyclopedia provides over 25,000 entries covering a variety of subject areas



This Explora interface accesses magazines, reference e-books, and thousands of primary source documents and videos curated for middle-school researchers.



The same Explora interface is used for both middle and high school students. It supports student research as well as classroom instruction. Each level of Explora accesses a different selection of databases.

What your *students* can do with Explora:



Search for articles, e-books, news, videos and more using a single search box



Browse popular topics by category to get research ideas



Read Topic Overviews to gain the background information they need to start their research



Hear HTML articles read aloud with EBSCO's Text-to-Speech feature (coming soon)



Save articles to Google Drive, Microsoft OneDrive or password protected-personal folders right in Explora



Use EBSCO's citation tool to properly format citations (MLA, APA, etc.)

What *you* can do with Explora:



Limit results to articles that are grade-appropriate and match student reading levels (Lexile® Measures)



Find content that aligns with curriculum standards across subject areas by using the recommended search strings in EBSCO's Curriculum Standards Module (US, Canada, Australia and New Zealand)



Search for content and embed links to full text in online course modules, all from within your school's learning management system (Schoology, Canvas, Blackboard, Moodle and Desire2Learn)



Share content with students via Google Classroom
