Database Highlights

We are highlighting two databases this month as they complement each other. The **BYKI** database teaches new languages and the **Global Road Warrior** gives information about 175 different countries from around the world and their traditions and/or cultures.

If you are traveling to a country, say Austria, and need to know which language is spoken, first go to **Global Road Warrior**. There you will learn that German is the national spoken language. Then you can go to **BYKI** to learn conversational German.
